Grants Awarded: \$145,878

The Trust awarded \$145,878 in matching funds to 34 projects across Idaho to preserve historic buildings and artifacts (listed above). The Owyhee County Historical

Society was selected as the Sister Alfreda Elsensohn Award Recipient of 2017; a joint \$10,000 award given by the Idaho State Historical Society, Idaho Humanities Council and the Idaho Heritage Trust to recognize outstanding museums in small communities. The Trust funded \$102,190 toward grants awarded in



previous years.
Highlights of completed projects include:
The Canyon
Creek Stage
Station in
Mountain Home
was built by the
Archibald Daniel
family when they
migrated west in
1874, providing
shelter and meals

for the last travelers of the Oregon Trail, Kelton Trail, and the Overland Stage Route. The station is being restored by the Bureau of Land Management with grants from the Idaho Heritage Trust and donations from the Idaho Chapter Oregon California Trails Association. The partnership received a "Heritage Heroes" award from the BLM Washington DC office in 2017. The station is part of the BLM Oregon Trail Byway Tour.

Wallace became the point at which Union Pacific and Northern Pacific railroad services connected in the Coeur d'Alene Mining District. Expanding operations led to the construction of this elegant depot in 1901. In 2017, a matching grant provided a new roof for this community focal point.



2017 Technical Assistance

Over the past year, the Trust provided a variety of technical services totaling \$30,654 for professional architectural, archaeological, and preservation assistance. Highlights include:



Stonebraker Ranch, Idaho Department of Fish & Game, Frank Church Wilderness Area

In 1898, Al Stonebraker, along with others constructed the Three Blaze Trail from the Salmon River to the Thunder Mountain Gold Mine. He homesteaded a ranch near

Chamberlain Basin where he worked as a hunting guide. 1928 brought backcountry aircraft to Stonebraker thus beginning a relationship of aerial transportation to the ranch for big game hunting parties. In 2000, the ranch was purchased by the Idaho Fish & Game. While the other backcountry ranches are now gone, Stonebraker remains today as a reminder of the earlier homestead ranches running big game hunting trips and raising cattle. The Trust provided a building assessment of the barn with various levels of conservation recommendations to the Idaho Fish & Game.

Stained Glass Conservation Workshop, Boise

Conserving stained glass windows in historic buildings requires an understanding of historic styles, the methods of fabrication, and recognition of conditions for conservation intervention. During the Idaho's Heritage Conference, the Trust provided a session on conservation of stained glass windows including a field trip to visit St. Michael's Episcopal Cathedral, to view an original Louis Comfort Tiffany window, one of only three known in the Northwest.



Welcome New Board Members
