2018 Annual Report

To preserve the historic fabric of Idaho for our Bicentennial in 2090, the Trust awarded \$127,575 in matching grants to 20 public organizations in 15 counties. The award of these grants will generate an additional \$665,000 in matching funds to complete these projects. The Trust funded \$123,000 toward grants awarded in previous years. \$60,221 was invested in technical assistance to the 2018 grant recipients and an additional 32 projects that we hope to have grant applications from in the future.

Projects

The Hemingway Home, constructed like the Sun Valley Lodge in 1953, is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. It was in this home that Hemingway ended his life and is buried nearby in the



Ketchum Cemetery. Mary continued to live in the home for the remainder of her life.



A 1923 **Dough** Boy sculpture by Avard Fairbanks (1897-1987) was erected in honor of the fighting men of Fremont County who served in WWI. Located in the St. Anthony City Park, the sculpture of Fremont County was restored with our matching grant.



The Oneida Pioneer Museum has one of the best collections of Pioneer Era Crayon Portraits in the state. More than 60 crayon (pencil) portraits of early settlers from 1860 - 1901

have been professionally repaired and preserved with grants from the Trust.

room schoolhouse is still utilized to teach kindergarten-6th grade.



Jim Moore moved from Kentucky in 1898 and established a placer claim along the Main Salmon River. The 10 hand-hewn log buildings that remain on the historic Jim Moore Place represent early life in the river canyon and are listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

Founded in 1990 to serve as a permanent legacy of Idaho's Centennial Celebration, our mission is to preserve the

historic fabric of Idaho for our Bicentennial. Royalties generated by the Trust's copyright and registered trademark of the scenic Idaho red,



white, and blue license plate are invested in an endowment fund. The earnings matched with funds raised by communities and other partners support the preservation of historic buildings, sites, and artifact collections throughout Idaho.

Since our founding the Trust has directly funded \$4.2M in grants and technical assistance to more than 550 historic buildings and sites in all 44 counties, with more than 50% to communities with less than 5,000 residents.
