

# Preserving Idaho's Heritage for our Bicentennial in 2090

## 2019 Annual Report

Celebrating Idaho's heritage, the Trust awarded \$157,430 in matching grants to 36 public organizations in 21 counties. The award of these grants will generate an additional \$290,000 in matching funds to complete these projects. The Trust funded \$105,000 toward grants awarded in previous years. \$56,500 was invested in technical assistance to the 2019 grant recipients and an additional 22 projects that we hope to have grant applications from in the future.

In cooperation with the Avista Corporate Fund for North Idaho, joint awards were given to the Fort Sherman Chapel located on the North Idaho College Campus in Coeur d'Alene, the White Spring Ranch Museum in Genesee, and the Heritage House, Nez Perce County Historical Museum in Lewiston. Projects to fund were selected by the board members after an application and a technical review by the Idaho State Historic Preservation and Idaho Parks & Recreation Offices and a regional volunteer committee review process.



#### **Feature Stories**

The **Upper Twin Lakes Schoolhouse** was built in 1920 to accommodate the population growth of families moving into the Twin Lakes area. The school operated until 1947. Since that time, the school has functioned as a community center to the local residents. The school is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.



The **Oregon Short Line Railway** in Nampa was the junction point of the Idaho Northern and the Boise, Nampa, and Owyhee railroads. The increasing business by 1900 led Union Pacific to build "the finest depot on the line" at Nampa in 1902. The stunning architecture of the depot was not a standard Union Pacific design. The depot is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

Thomas Sleight arrived in Paris in 1863 and constructed this small cabin that was shared by two families. Thirty cabins were built that same winter and this is the only one remaining. It is located in the city park and visited by busloads of tourists each summer. For 156 years and 7 generations, members of the posterity of Thomas Sleight have lived in Paris and the surrounding communities.
